

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I. Overview


II. Track
Placement

The Curriculum consists of three tracks.

Placement in the appropriate track ensures that every student can achieve the best learning outcomes. Pre & post assessments will also be conducted to measure student progress.

II. Track Placement

- * Students fulfilling one of the three conditions:
- 1. Enrolled MCU with an international passport and are native English speakers, or whose countries use English as the official language (as indicated on the website of Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Republic of China); or
- 2. Provide a high school certificate or transcript to prove all courses were taught in English; or
- 3. Provide a CEFR B2 result from a recognized English Proficiency Test.




CEFR Levels and English Proficiency Scores




III. Placement Test

- 1. Enrolled MCU with an international passport and are native English speakers, or whose countries use English as the official language (as indicated on the website of Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Republic of China);
- 2. Provide a high school certificate or transcript to prove all courses were taught in English;
- 3. Provide a CEFR B2 level result from a recognized English Proficiency Test. Students need to pass the three courses to fulfill the 9-credit requirement.

V. Course Descriptions



English Enhancement (0)

- This course provides a strong foundation in English proficiency skills, and strengthens the listening and reading skills for general purposes utilizing the advantages of online learning.
- Students view pre-recorded instructions and follow directions on the Moodle platform for assignments and practices at their own pace.
- Students are also required to attend several face-to-face sessions with the instructor throughout the semester (the date and time to be announced prior to each session).
- Students need to pass this course as a prerequisite for taking the Regular Track courses to fulfill the 9-credit requirement.

V. Course Descriptions

Regular Track

Academic Oral Communication (3)

This course emphasizes the development of fluency and intelligibility in spoken English in an academic setting. Students work on improving pronunciation, practicing classroom conversation and discussion strategies, and delivering academic oral presentations through individual and group activities.

• Academic Reading and Writing I (3)

This course helps students develop academic vocabulary and reading strategies required to comprehend academic contents in a variety of topics. Students also learn the foundations of writing to develop well-structured sentences and paragraphs. Students are also introduced to different types of short essays.

Academic Reading and Writing II (3)

This course helps students improve their overall academic reading and writing competency. With an emphasis on research paper writing, students learn how to support claims with explicit reasoning and textual evidence, and know how to use accurate APA style conventions in paraphrasing, quotation and citation. Students enhance their writing skills through the process of planning, drafting, revising, editing and peer reviewing.

V. Course Descriptions

Advanced Track

Advanced Seminar I/II/III (3/3/3)

These courses offer students a synthesis and application of knowledge and skills developed through previous studies. Course contents include in-depth discussions of academic topics in various subjects and international current affairs, and project-based activities on and/or off campus. Students demonstrate self-assessment, critical thinking, ethical reflection, cooperative and collaborative teamwork.

VI. Pre & Post Assessments

- There are 2 pre-assessments and 1 postassessment in one academic year.
 - Pre-assessments (Placement Tests)
 - The first pre-assessment takes place in Week 1 of Fall semester.
 - The second pre-assessment will be conducted in Week 1 of Spring semester.
 - Pre assessments are required for those without a CEFR score for placement.
 - Post-assessment
 - The post-assessment will take place in Week 18* (final exam week) of Spring semester.
 - All students are required to take the post assessment.

VII. English Testing Award Policy (ELC)

- Ming Chuan University English

 - Offered by the English LanguageCenter (ELC)
 - Freshman students who are admitted to MCU in the academic year of Fall 2021 may only use tests taken after August 1, 2021 to apply for the award.
